Young people with disabilities and their guardians from the Czech Republic came to Bydgoszcz, at the invitation of the Faculty of Health Sciences and Physical Education of the Kazimierz Wielki University (https://kulturafizyczna.ukw.edu.pl//unita/wydzial-nauk-o-zdrowieu/). , Slovakia and Hungary - twenty people in total.

The representatives of the Bydgoszcz community of young people with disabilities were students from the Kujawsko-Pomorskie Special Educational Center No. 1 for Children and Youth with Visually Impaired and Blind children. L. Braille.

On April 26, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., workshops on tennis for blind and visually impaired people were held on the "Zawisza" Bydgoszcz tennis courts. The difference between blind tennis and regular tennis is the different number of bounces of the ball from the ground. Players who are completely blind and have limited vision can wait for three dribbles, while tennis players who can see a little better can wait for two bounces of the ball. Blind tennis balls rattle during bounce, allowing the player to locate the ball's position. Traditional tennis rackets are used in sports competitions.

Blind tennis workshops were prepared by students of the Kuyavian-Pomeranian Voivodeship Special Educational Center No. 1 for Children and Youth with Visually Impaired and Blind children. L. Braille and by the Polish Tennis Association and the Kuyavian-Pomeranian Tennis Association. The workshops were led by Bernadeta Krupecka-Benramdane and her students: Anna Sulimowska, Maria Komasińska, Kamil Byczyński, Oliwia Lorent. The sports competition was observed by: Anna Niewiadomska, Plenipotentiary of the Kuyavian-Pomeranian Voivodeship for the Development of Civil Society and Cooperation with Non-Governmental Organizations, Agnieszka Dziedzic and Aneta Budzałek from the Polish Tennis Association, and Renata Sokołowska, president of the Kuyavian-Pomeranian Tennis Association.

Then, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., at the Education Center for Physical Culture and Sports of the Kazimierz Wielki University, sports competitions were held in which students competed:

In the evening, the Visegrad grant participants took part in a cruise on the Brda River on the "Słonecznik" tourist ship. On April 27, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., goalball, showdown and sports shooting workshops for the blind were held in the sports hall of the Kazimierz Wielki University at 30 Chodkiewicza Street. The workshops were conducted by: Radosław Cichański - representative of the Rector of UKW for people with disabilities (https://niepelnosprawni.ukw.edu.pl/strona/niepelnosprawni) and Łukasz Skąpski together with Łukasz Zdunkiewicz and Marek Janakowski from the Blind Sports Club "Łuczniczka" and Tomasz Kowalik from the Kujawsko-Pomorskie Special Educational Center No. 1 for Children and Youth with Visual Impairment and the Blind.

The level of difficulty of competing in the above-mentioned blind sports was very high because the participants were blindfolded and had to rely solely on auditory perception.

In goalball, players lie in front of their goal, measuring 9 x 1.3 m, and use their hearing to try to catch the ball thrown by the opponent or to cover its access to the goal with their bodies, remembering to protect their faces before hitting the ball. The ball has bells that help locate changes in the ball's position. Showdown - is an equivalent of table tennis, in which, on a table covered with fences, participants hit a buzzing ball using wooden, rectangular bats, trying to hit the opponent's goal, located in a similar way to the goals in manually controlled "table football". Sports shooting is based on positioning the rifle barrel at the target where the sound signal from the shooter's headphones is the loudest. All these sports competitions, after eliminating visual perception, are very difficult to perform.
